



WORSHIP NOTES

This morning's Gospel text tells the story of Jesus' calling ordinary fisherfolk away from their nets and into kingdom work. Both of our very contemporary hymns (1980's) retell that story in their own way. United Church of Canada minister Sylvia Dunstan (1955–1993) wrote *You Walk Along Our Shoreline*. The Reverend Dunstan was brought up in the Salvation Army and went on to become a prison chaplain, so in most of her hymns, you can hear echoes of her experiences with the poor and disenfranchised. Our Hymnal contains eight of her hymns, including *Christus Paradox*, which we sing frequently here. Ms. Dunstan's late-twentieth-century text is married to the late-sixteenth-century tune WIE LIEBLICH IST DER MAIEN, which Germanaphones will tell you means "How Lovely Is the Month of May," originally written for a secular song, as you can tell.

The beloved hymn *Will You Come and Follow Me* (often called "The Summons") was written by John Bell, one of the world's most accomplished composers of contemporary Christian music. Mr. Bell writes music for the Iona Community, a quasi-monastic fellowship on an island off the coast of Scotland. We Kenilworth Union pilgrims went to Scotland two years ago, and were supposed to visit Ioana, but high seas prevented us from braving the passage. The Iona Community sends young people to live with a family in an impoverished part of Scotland for a year; John Bell wrote this hymn to mark the youths' "Summons" to

Kingdom work, just like the first disciples. Mr. Bell's text is matched with a traditional, nineteenth-century Scottish tune called KELVINGROVE, named for one of the first Scottish parks in Glasgow.
