When I sat down to talk with Squire for this newsletter, I asked him what his favorite youth group game was: Catacombs. To Bless the Space Between Us: We begin a new sermon series next Sunday, John O’Donohue says “a blessing evokes a privileged intimacy...[a blessing] touches that tender membrane where the human heart cries out to its divine ground...a blessing is not a sentiment or a question; it is a gracious invocation where the human heart pleads with the divine.” Let us seek, then, “to bless the space between us” as O’Donohue’s book title suggests. He blesses love, longing, growing up, friendship, freedom, change, pain, family, and the-self-in-relation-to-the-divine.
