The All-Saints Vespers Service of Remembrance is an extension of the care ministries at Kenilworth Union Church. Thank you to the Congregational Care Committee, including the Stephen Ministry team. Tonight's readers are Stephen Ministers. Several Stephen Ministers will be present and available after the worship service if you'd like to spend more time talking about the loved one you are remembering today. Often, having space to speak your loved one's name aloud and share about a loved one's life can be healing. Stephen Ministers welcome your stories, your tears, your expressions of love and grief. Whether simply to have a listening ear tonight, or to be paired in a longer-term relationship, Stephen Ministers are one of the ways that Kenilworth Union Church lives into Jesus' call to "love one another, even as I have loved you, that you also love one another."

Stephen Ministry is a one-to-one lay caring ministry that is grounded in a biblical understanding of Jesus who says, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." It helps those who need someone to walk alongside them in faith and prayer in seasons when they are overwhelmed, such as loss of a loved one, loss of a job, becoming an "empty nester," moving to a new location, coping with a chronic or terminal illness, caring for a loved one who is sick, or other situations. When you are paired with a Stephen Minister, you will typically meet once a week for about an hour. Your Stephen Minister will continue to meet with you as long as needed. You will decide together when you're ready to bring the caring relationship to a close. Every person and their situation is different, but most people we work with say having a Stephen Minister is a comforting and healing experience.
